

# Parents Challenge Parent Commitment Form



Parents Challenge is not a charity. We partner with parents, empowering them with information and financial resources so that they can take more control of their and their children’s lives. It is a partnership built on mutual expectations. In exchange for having access to Parents Challenge resources, parents commit to being directly involved in their children’s education – evidenced in meeting the minimum accountability statements that are aligned with program outcomes and parental responsibilities.

1.	We will be engaged in the monitoring of our scholar(s) homework (administered by the school or us as parents).
2.	We will make sure our scholar(s) attend school and are on-time (virtual or in-person).
3.	We promise to keep abreast of the academics of our scholar(s) and report such progress to Parents Challenge on a semester and yearly basis. We agree our scholar(s) will maintain a grade of “C” or better and obtain support if they are not meeting this requirement.
4.	We will report all assessment data that will show our scholar(s) academic progress on a quarterly, semester or yearly basis, as requested.
5.	To support our scholar(s) education, we will pay any additional funds to keep our child engaged in the activities that will promote a “whole child” experience.
6.	We will keep abreast of all financial payments to schools where our scholar(s) is/are enrolled, and we will submit financial request that support the academic enhancement plans for our scholar(s).
7.	We will provide opportunities for our scholar(s) to become life-long readers and learners, i.e., join the library, go to museums, participate in afterschool programs, or weekend outings.
8.	We agree (unless legally binding) that we will allow Parents Challenge to photograph, interview or print information on our family. We agree that any information submitted or provided to Parents Challenge becomes the property of the organization.
9.	We agree to volunteer a minimum of 20 hours per year at our school of choice or volunteer in the community at an organization of our choice.
10.	We agree to attend and participate in a minimum of six (6) parent empowerment sessions each year (virtual or in-person). Three per semester are required.
